RULES

- 1. Members and Non-Members may exhibit in the Show.
- 2. LATEST DATE FOR ENTRIES. All entries must be made on the official entry form NOT LATER THAN 8.00 p.m. on the Wednesday before the Show and will not be accepted over the telephone.
- 3. EXHIBITORS CARDS. Each exhibit must bear a card showing the Exhibitor's number and Class number, these are obtained from the Show Secretary before staging. All cards must be in position by 10 a.m. Exhibitors are responsible for placing these cards and checking the correctness of the details on them.
- 1. NUMBERS OF ENTRIES IN A CLASS. Exhibitors are not allowed to enter more than one exhibit in any class.
- 5. ALL ENTRIES to be grown or made by the exhibitor, except in Floral Art Classes.
- 5. ENTRIES. The Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry.
- 7. THE MIXING OF KINDS IS NOT ALLOWED. The mixing of two or more on one plate or in one vase is not allowed unless stated in the schedule.
- PLATES & VASES Exhibitors are asked to provide the necessary plates and vases. A limited number of flower vases can be loaned from the Committee and MUST BE RETURNED to a Committee member at the end of the Show.
-). NAMING OF EXHIBITS is optional.
- PLAIN CLEAR GLASS JARS should be used for exhibiting preserves, these should be covered with waxed discs and transparent tops, no screw tops allowed.
- 11. COOKERY Plates must be covered with clear plastic bags.
- 12. CHILDREN'S exhibits must be their own unaided work. A slip of paper should be attached to their exhibit stating their AGE (not name) for classes 122-131. Children must not enter the Cakes and Savouries Section.
- 13. TIME OF STAGING OF EXHIBITS is from <u>7.30a.m. 10a.m.</u> on Show Day. At 10a.m. all persons are asked to leave the hall except those authorised by the Committee. This rule WILL BE STRICTLY ENFORCED.

- 14. ALTERATION OF EXHIBITS. Between the time for the completion of staging and the opening of the Show no exhibit may be altered or removed except by the permission of the Show Secretary.
- 15. THE COMMITTEE WILL NOT BE RESPONSIBLE for any loss or damage to exhibits or personal property.
- 16. THE JUDGES MAY withhold any or all prizes where the exhibits are found to be not of sufficient merit. Judges are asked NOT to duplicate prizes.
- 17. The decision of the judges shall be final as to the relative merits of the exhibits, and the decision of the Committee shall be final on all matters connected with the Show.
- 18. REMOVAL OF EXHIBITS. The Raffle & Presentation of awards will start at 4.30pm. On completion of this, all exhibits CAN BE REMOVED. All exhibitors are responsible for the safe removal of their own exhibits AT THE CLOSE OF THE SHOW.
- 19. PROTESTS. Any protest must be delivered in writing to the Show Secretary by 2.30 p m on Show Day and must be accompanied by a deposit of £1, which will be refunded if the protest is upheld.
- 20. PAYMENT OF PRIZE MONEY by the Treasurer will take place after 2.30 p.m. on Show Day, or by applying to the Treasurer before 21st August. Prize money not claimed after that date will be returned to the Society's account.
- 21. CHALLENGE CUPS & TROPHIES won by exhibitors remain the property of the Society and must not be tampered with in any way. The Committee would be grateful if cups could be handed back to

Mr. D.Harris, 5 Hazel Cresent, Thornbury at least 2 weeks before the show, and must on no account be returned by post. The Society has experienced problems of broken and damaged trophies with this method of transit If you have difficulty in returning any trophy please contact Mr. D. Harris at least 2 weeks before the show on 01454 414070.

- POINTS will be awarded to prize winners as follows: 1ST Prize 3 Points
 2ND Prize 2 Points
 3RD Prize 1 Point
 - Except for Class 22 Top Tray Class where points are:1ST Prize 6 Points 2ND Prize 4 Points 3RD Prize 2 points
- 23. IN THE EVENT OF A TIE for any trophy the exhibitor gaining the most 1st prizes will be declared the winner
